- financial support for the establishment of a collaborative mentoring steering committee, which includes your ATA local, school district and the Association.

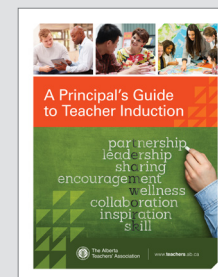
## FEATURED WORKSHOP
