You are key to PEC Election communications

The Alberta Teachers' Association is the voice of the teaching profession in our province, and our voice is made stronger by our members.

In your role with the Association, you may be asked questions about the 2023 PEC Election. To help you answer them, we have developed this primer.

Whether you are involved with Association locals, committees, councils or teachers' convention associations, this information will help you to help us keep ATA members on top of all things election—from the nomination call to the announcement of the election results.



GET READY

Just as we want candidates to be ready for the 2023 PEC Election, we want the same for you.

Answers to many of the questions you will be asked can be found in the special election section on the ATA website. Here are the top 3 questions you may be asked:

WHAT IS PEC?

Provincial Executive Council (PEC) is the 20-member executive committee responsible for directing the business of the Alberta Teachers' Association.

Its membership consists of the ATA president, two vice-presidents, the past president, 15 district representatives and the executive secretary.

WHAT IS A PEC ELECTION?

With the exception of the past president and executive secretary, members of PEC are elected.

As per its general bylaws, the Association opens nominations every two years and conducts an election to fill PEC's president, vice-president and district representative positions.

WHY IS PEC IMPORTANT?

PEC is important because teachers are important.

The Alberta Teachers' Association is the professional organization and legal bargaining agent of teachers employed by Alberta's public, separate and francophone school boards. It represents its members on matters affecting teachers and the teaching profession.

Members of PEC present to the Association the issues and perspectives of teachers from across the province. They bring your voice to the Association in order to make it heard by the provincial government and other education stakeholders at provincial, national and even international levels.





As teachers, you are naturals at sharing knowledge, so we are asking you to help us out.

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2023 PEC ELECTION SCHEDULE

Here are some important dates and information for you to keep in mind.

OCTOBER 16

NOMINATION CALL

The Association opens nominations for elected PEC positions. This call for nominations is made through a school mailing to school representatives, the ATA website, the ATA News and the Association's social media channels.

Members interested in running in the 2023 PEC election will find all the information and the candidate declaration form on the ATA website.

JANUARY 18

NOMINATION DEADLINE

Nomination Deadline is the date by which all prospective candidates must submit their completed nomination forms to the Association.

Only nomination forms received by the Nomination Deadline will be accepted, so it is important prospective candidates review the *Candidates' Handbook* and ensure they are prepared to meet all requirements.

FEBRUARY 14-15

SPECIAL PEC ELECTION SCHOOL MAILING

The Association will send a special mailing containing only election materials to schools in February. A poster promoting the voting period of the election and candidate campaign materials will be included.

Also included will be voting instructions for school representatives to distribute to each teacher on their school staff.

This mailing will be sent to the attention of the school representative(s) at schools employing three or more ATA members. Where two or fewer ATA members are employed at a school, voting instructions only will be mailed to the home addresses of those members.

MARCH 13-16

VOTING

Voting is open 24/7 starting at 8 AM on March 13 and ending at 5 PM on March 16.

MARCH 17

RESULTS ANNOUNCEMENT

Election results are posted on the ATA website and social media the day after voting closes. Coverage will also appear in the ATA News.
